



CANADA STUDENT LOANS AND GRANTS

The Canada Student Loans and Grants program works in partnership with provinces and territories to deliver student financial assistance to Canadians and provide opportunities to pursue post-secondary education.

Student loans need to be paid back; grants are money you don't need to pay back!

What's available in loans?

- Up to \$210 per week in federal loans for full-time students (participating provincial and territorial governments also offer student financial assistance programs).
- Up to \$10,000 in federal loans for part-time students.

Who Qualifies for Grants?

Students are automatically assessed for grants when they apply and qualify for a Canada Student Loan (a separate application is needed only for the *Grant for Services and Equipment for Students with Permanent Disabilities*). Students must apply for a Canada Student Loan through their province or territory of permanent residence.
