- Research Duties:** All tenure-track faculty members are expected to [engage in scholarly activity](#) (some combination of discovery/integration/application/pedagogy) and to publish results.
- Professional Duties:** All tenure-track faculty members serve the community in various ways out of their expertise and share in faculty administration.

Particulars of the Position:

The successful candidate will demonstrate teaching excellence and active research and publication, with a focus in British medieval and/or Renaissance literature; and will also demonstrate strong interdisciplinary interests in fields outside of his or her core research area. The King's University College's program in English literature emphasizes world literature in English within an interdisciplinary context. The program is deeply rooted in the British literary tradition, but trains its students in an awareness of the multitudinous narrative strains that emerge from that British root and evolve into a global English literature. King's is a research oriented Christian undergraduate institution with an established record for teaching excellence. King's faculty normally teach 3 courses per term, including introductory courses.
