The King's University College is pleased to announce that its Chemistry program has received accreditation from the Canadian Society for Chemistry. This recognition was based on a thorough review and site visit conducted last summer. King's is by far the smallest institution to achieve this accreditation for its 3 and 4-year Chemistry degrees. This achievement goes a long way in further establishing the professional status of King's chemistry graduates.

The Alberta government has also authorized King's to offer a 4-year History degree starting September 2007. Students will be able to specialize in the history of the Anglo-American world or Modern Europe. This new degree builds on the 3-year degree and more than 25 years of teaching history from a distinctively Christian perspective.

King's will also begin offering a new minor in Physical Education starting September 2007. This minor can be combined with any other degree at King's such as Biology, History, or Psychology among others. The minor will especially benefit athletes and students considering teacher preparation through King's B.Ed. program.

The King's University College offers fully-accredited Bachelor degrees in the arts, humanities, music, social sciences, natural sciences and commerce/management, as well as a Bachelor of Education after-degree.

Established in 1979, King's currently serves almost 580 students. Students come from Canada and abroad, representing more than 16 nations. Faculty are highly qualified, dedicated Christians committed to academic excellence and bringing a distinctly Christian perspective into the classroom.
