With a focus on improving curriculum, teaching pedagogy, assessment, and delivery in face-to-face, hybrid and online classroom experiences, this position is the number one resource faculty members can turn to when they need assistance or resources. Part time employment may be considered for exceptionally qualified candidates.

 - Coordinate with the Faculty of Education to better utilize resources for faculty development
