





Off-Campus and Study Abroad Programs


Quest Mexico

Application Deadlines

Apply early to receive a reduced application fee. Early application deadlines are April 15 for the fall term and August 15 for the winter term.

Total \$29,913

A \$5,000 international tuition deposit is due after final admission. Students may not register in courses it has been paid.

A \$500 deposit is due with residence application.

Scholarships & Financial Aid

Students are automatically awarded scholarships based on the average grade of their highest 4 standard courses: 90-100% \$3,000 \$2,000 80-89%

A transfer scholarship of \$1,500 is available to students transferring from another institution with a CGPA of 3.50-4.00.

International students also qualify for scholarships! Check the description of each scholarship to see if the award is limited to Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents — if not, you are eligible.
