POSITION SUMMARY

Under the direction of the Dean of Students, and lead by the Coordinator of Wellness and Counseling Services/Lead Psychologist in regard to professional practice and therapeutic work, the part-time Counseling Psychologist provides current students with short-term counseling, group counseling, supports with medical and psychiatric referrals, and referrals to therapists who are off campus. Working one or two mornings/afternoons/evenings a week, the Counselling Psychologist provides crucial support to King's mental health and wellness team. The Counseling Psychologist may also at times cooperate with mental health outreach, preventative action, in-service training and assistance for crisis response, and consultation services to students and other members of university community.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide short-term counseling to individuals and groups, including crisis intervention, counseling, referrals, resources and follow-up. Maintain regular counseling hours and appointments.
- Maintain detailed and confidential records regarding counseling sessions, interventions, and referrals following King's counseling team practices and CAP guidelines.
- When possible, use available time to stay up-to-date information about and help students access community resources, referral resources and therapeutic practices.
- Complete training(s) as requested/required in order to maintain best practice.
- Will attend Counselling Team meetings (minimum 4 meetings per 8-month contract) as well as 4 individual clinical supervision/case consult with Lead Psychologist.
- When asked, offer general support and consultation with faculty and staff as appropriate, and with student consent when needed, in regard to supporting student success in and out of the classroom.
- Other duties as assigned by Dean of Students and/or Coordinator of Wellness and Counselling Services/Lead Psychologist.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Master's Degree in Counseling Psychology or related field required.
- Current registration with College of Alberta Psychologists preferred. Provisional registration considered.
- Up to date professional liability insurance as recommended by CAP.
- A knowledge of Jane App platform is considered an asset.
