

Student Navigator

Purpose:

As a volunteer working with the Student Life team and Faculty Mentors, Student Navigators main objective is to engage in intentional relationship building with new students to become an integral part of The King's University (TKU) community as they transition to TKU through the First Year Experience Program (FYE). They will provide support with all aspects of New Student Move-In and Orientation: Welcome to Campus. The Student Navigator will welcome new students and be a resource to help students acclimate to The King's campus. Student Navigators will be assigned a specific group of new students, led by a Faculty Mentor, to check in on and provide support and guidance (a minimum of 2 times throughout the semester.)

Qualifications:

- Registered in at least your second academic year at King's.
- Ability to develop strong interpersonal relationships, work independently and be selfmotivated.
- Effective time management skills and organizational skills
- Confidence in leading groups of students and providing support/resources.
- Strong communication and problem-solving skills.
- Self-reflective, mature, and reliable.
- Awareness of and sensitivity to needs of new students.
- Non-judgemental and open minded.
- Open and willing to serve within a Christian context.
- Support the King's mission and vision as well as demonstrate a commitment to King's community values.
- Maintain a current and cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above.

Responsibilities and Expectations:

- Attend orientation (fall and winter) to welcome incoming new students into King's.
- Remain knowledgeable of on-campus resources and services.
- Provide one on one and/or group time with assigned group of new students.
- Be able to answer questions and provide guidance around what it means to be a student at King's.
- Serve as a role model by demonstrating integrity inside and outside of the classroom.
- Demonstrate ability to develop strong interpersonal relationships.
- Demonstrate sensitivity toward issues that impact diversity, equity and inclusion through friendship and advocacy for students.
