




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Programs at King's



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



Services and supports for those with documented physical or cognitive disabilities ensure that all students have the opportunity to thrive in their studies.


Academic advising

Application deadlines

Fall term **August 15** Winter term December 1 Scholarships and awards March 31 Student employment August 15

Admission requirements

High school applicants will be considered based on the following requirements:

- ► Grade average of 60% or higher
- ► An approved grade 12-level English course
- ▶ Three standard grade 12 courses
- One additional standard or non-standard grade 12 course

Tuition and fees

Tuition \$442/credit Fees \$1,925/year Residence \$2,640 - \$4,500/year Meal plan \$3,836 - \$4,404/year

Scholarships & financial aid

Students are considered for scholarships based on the average of their top four standard courses:

90-100% \$3,000 80-89% \$2,000

A transfer scholarship of \$1,500 is available to students transferring from another institution with a cumulative GPA of 3.50 - 4.00.

Visit kingsu.ca/scholarships for a full list of scholarships and bursaries and to access the scholarships and awards application.

Federal and provincial government aid is available for students who qualify. Applications must be submitted to your province or territory of residence. It is best to apply for government aid at least six weeks prior to the start of classes to ensure funds arrive on time.

Visit kingsu.ca/student-employment to find on-campus employment opportunities. It's recommended that you apply early.
