The Faculty of Natural Science at The King's University invites applications for a full-time, tenure track appointment in the 4-year BSc Computing Science program, beginning August 1, 2024. Our Computing Science program offer students rich and rigorous study in the core discipline of Computing Science, as well as opportunities to pursue program streams in Software Systems Development, Secure Computing, Computer Graphics and Visualization, and Theoretical Computing. The program has existing strengths in Computer Graphics, Artificial Intelligence, Software Engineering, Software Testing, and Software Security. The King's University offers a supportive community for faculty and students alike and our programs benefit from small class sizes providing ample opportunities to mentor students. All members of the Faculty of Natural Science are encouraged to pursue external research funding. Many are recognized for involving undergraduate students in their scholarship and are funded through a variety of external bodies including NSERC, SSHRC, and Alberta Innovates. We are seeking a new faculty member who can help us enrich our program offerings across the curriculum.

SPECIFICATIONS

The position is open to excellent candidates in all areas of computer science and closely related disciplines. The ideal candidates will bring with them a dedication to excellence in teaching, with an ability to teach a variety of courses in Computing Science. They will be required to work closely with other faculty to deliver courses and contribute to the interdisciplinary learning environment. We seek a candidate that will augment our teaching and research strengths, bringing innovative and diverse perspectives and experiences.

Responsibilities include:

Teaching of 4 courses with labs (or equivalent) per year in undergraduate programming Engagement in an on-going scholarly research program

Engagement in on-going service to the department, the Faculty of Natural Science, and the greater University community and external stakeholders

Creating connections and developing relationships with students through advising, research supervision, and mentoring

The successful candidate will demonstrate a growing and evolving ability to articulate the connection between Computing Science and Christian faith in a way that encourages students to envision their education and vocation as consistent with their worldview.

The successful candidate is required to hold a Ph.D. in Computing Science or a related discipline. Candidates who are close to Ph.D. completion may be considered; however, the appointment will be contingent upon the completion of the Ph.D. by an agreed-upon date.

The King's University is a Christian liberal arts university offering three and four-year Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees, a Bachelor of Commerce, a Bachelor of Music, and a two-year after-degree Bachelor of Education (Elementary and Secondary) accredited by the province of Alberta. The University is a member of Universities Canada and of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities. Faculty members at The King's University are eligible for and are currently receiving Tri-Council funding. The faculty at The King's University are recognized for involving undergraduate students in their scholarship, with some faculty members having obtained external funding.
