POSITION SUMMARY

The King's University is inviting applications from scholars to be nominated for a Tier II Canada Research Chair in Urban Ecology. Preference will be given to candidates who can help advance our goal of engaging various stakeholder groups by connecting their scholarship to other scholars, undergraduate students, and the public. A special focus on urban ecology in a time of ecological change is preferred and synergies with the King's University's Creation Care Centre, Micah Centre, and sustainability hub are an asset.

SPECIFICATIONS

The ideal candidate will bring with them a dedication to excellence in research, teaching, and service in Urban Ecology.

Responsibilities include:

- teach two courses a year in an area related to their discipline.
- Conduct an internationally recognized research program as befits a Tier II Canada Research Chair
- Mentor undergraduate research students,
- Collaborate with other scholars to enhance scholarship at the University

QUALIFICATIONS

The successful candidate will hold a Ph.D. in ecology or related field (this is an institutional not a CRC requirement).

They will demonstrate a clear track record of research in Urban Ecology. Tier 2 Chairs are intended for exceptional emerging scholars (i.e., candidates must have been an active researcher in their field for fewer than 10 years at the time of nomination).

They must be an emerging scholars; nominating institutions may nominate a professor or a researcher who is more than 10 years from their highest degree at the time of nomination and has experienced legitimate career interruptions (see the CRC site for <u>acceptable Justifications</u>) such as

• eligible leaves (e.g., maternity, parental, medical, bereavement) are credited at twice the amount of time taken;

- part-time leaves will be taken into consideration, calculated according to the percentage of leave taken, and credited at twice the amount of time taken;
- professional leaves (e.g., sabbatical) are not credited, but certain training or administrative leaves may be considered.
- Other leaves that have had an impact on the nominee's research career may be taken into account
- Research interruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic (e.g., closures) are recognized as, and may be counted as, an eligible delay (credited at twice the amount of time) beginning March 1, 2020.

Interruptions and other life circumstances that have affected research productivity will also be considered during the hiring process.

ACADEMIC RANK

Assistant Professor. Highly qualified candidates will be considered at higher rank.

The King's University is a Christian liberal arts university offering three and four-year Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees, a Bachelor of Commerce, a Bachelor of Music, and a two-year after-degree Bachelor of Education (Elementary and Secondary) accredited by the province of Alberta.
