- Possession of Lifesaving Society Swim Instructor/Examiner Award (SFL)
- Possession of Lifesaving Society Instructor/Examiner Award (LSI)
- Possession of Lifesaving Society Bronze Cross or Lifesaving Society National Lifeguard
- Possession of current Intermediate (Standard) First Aid from a Government approved first aid provider (Emergency First Aid is not acceptable)
- All awards must be kept current according to certifying organizations' standards
- Knowledge of principles, practices, and techniques employed in water safety and life-saving activities
- Ability to act quickly and calmly in urgent situations
- Ability to demonstrate excellent communication and instructional skills
- Ability to resolve conflict using diplomacy and problem-solving skills
- Ability to speak another language would be considered an asset
- Commitment to improve results of swim lessons and assisting co-workers and supervisors with tasks whenever needed
