POSITION SUMMARY

The Faculty of Arts at The King's University invites applications for a full-time, tenure track appointment in our 3-year and 4-year History programs, beginning August 1, 2025. The successful candidate will also contribute courses to our 4-year PHE (Politics, History, Economics) program. We are committed to creating a vibrant History program at King's that fosters the inclusion of diverse perspectives and seeks to listen to the voices of marginalized people.

KEY DETAILS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The ideal candidates for the position must clearly demonstrate a record of, or clear potential for, excellence in scholarship, teaching, and student mentorship. We encourage applications from any field of history, but preference will be given to candidates who can further develop our work in Public History, as well as being able to offer courses in social/cultural history and/or specialisms outside of Europe and North America. They will teach a variety of courses in the History program and demonstrate a commitment to active, student-centered teaching approaches which engage and inspire their students. Historians who can contribute to [or support] our new Indigenous Studies minor are also encouraged to consider this opportunity. The successful candidate will have an innovative and active program of research, and a clear plan for developing their scholarship.

Responsibilities include:

- Teaching the equivalent of 6 courses per year in undergraduate programming
- Teaching a common curriculum course World History 1500- present which all students must take
- Teaching courses in Historical Methods
- Engagement in an on-going scholarly research program
- On-going service to the History department, the Faculty of Arts, and the greater university community and external stakeholders
- Creating connections and developing relationships with students through advising, research supervision, and mentoring

The successful candidate will demonstrate a growing and evolving ability to articulate the connection between History and the Christian faith. Their approach would welcome diverse students and colleagues into a shared project of understanding our world - past and present - in the light of core faith commitments and values.

The successful candidate will have the opportunity to develop courses in areas related to their research expertise, and to work in an interdisciplinary and collegial environment that also values autonomy and scholarly development.

The successful candidate is required to hold a Ph.D. or equivalent in History (any field). Candidates who are close to Ph.D. completion are encouraged to apply; the appointment will be contingent upon the completion of the Ph.D. by an agreed-upon date.

The King's University is a Christian liberal arts university offering three and four-year Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees, a Bachelor of Commerce, a Bachelor of Music, and a two-year after-degree Bachelor of Education (Elementary and Secondary) accredited by the province of Alberta. The University is a member of Universities Canada and of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities. Faculty members at The King's University are eligible for and are currently receiving Tri-Council funding. The faculty at The King's University are recognized for involving undergraduate students in their scholarship, with some faculty members having obtained external funding.
