Position Summary: Teach *Chemistry 440: Environmental Chemistry (Atmosphere/Environmental organics)* in the winter term of the 2019-2020 academic year. This class meets Tuesday/Thursday from 12:30-2:00 p.m. and a lab Thursday from 2:00-5:00 p.m.

Course Description: CHEM 440: This course is an introduction to the chemistry of the environment and chemical toxicology. A study of chemical processes occurring in the atmosphere, natural and wastewaters, and soils. Mechanisms for the introduction of pollutants to the environment and methods for the removal of pollutants are studied. The focus is on anthropogenic sources of pollutants and their speciation, transport, and interaction with natural processes.
