Position Summary: Teach *Biology 207: Human Anatomy* in the winter term of the 2019-2020 academic year. This class meets Tuesday/Thursday from 8:00 to 9:30 a.m. and has two labs, on Monday/Wednesday from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Course Description: BIOL 207: Introductory study of the human body which includes structural and functional components of selected systems. This course is designed to provide the student with a systematic description of the anatomical structure and function of the human body. Students will gain an understanding of human gross anatomy and a working knowledge of the integration of the human body's major physiological systems. Emphasis will also be placed on critical thinking, active questioning and an appreciation for health and disease from a gross anatomical perspective.
