Position Summary: Teach *Chemistry 450: Advanced Organic Chemistry* in the fall term of the 2019-2020 academic year. This class meets Tuesday /Thursday from 9:30-11:00 a.m. and a lab Thursday from 2:00-5:00 p.m.

Course Description: CHEM 450: The correlation between structure and reactivity of complex organic molecules is studied through reaction mechanisms. Concepts important to theoretical organic chemistry are introduced and applied. Laboratories focus on synthetic organic chemistry and physical organic techniques. Microscale organic techniques are utilized in the laboratory, as well as computer modelling of organic structures.

Alternatively, applicants with specialized training in another area of advanced chemistry able to offer a senior special topics course in an area such as medicinal chemistry, bioinorganic chemistry, or materials chemistry may be considered.
