Tier II Canada Research Chair Transition to Sustainability

The King's University invites applications from qualified scholars for nomination to a Tier II Canada Research Chair tenure-track faculty position. Candidates with a doctoral degree and a record of publication in the social science of transitions to environmental sustainability are encouraged to apply. Disciplinary appointment is possible in any of the following: Political Science, Economics, Geography, Psychology, Sociology, Business, or Environmental Studies.

Current debates about sustainability focus on a critique of the socio-economic and cultural systems that underlie ecological crises, but often fall short in providing alternatives. The intent for this Tier II Canada Research Chair is to build on the critique by developing these alternatives, and charting the pathways of this transition to socio-ecological sustainability.

The King's University encourages members of designated groups (women, members of visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples, and person with disabilities) to apply.

Inquiries are strongly encouraged and all inquiries will receive a response.

The successful candidate will have obtained a PhD or equivalent within ten years of nomination to the Canada Research Chair position and will be an outstanding emerging scholar with a demonstrated potential to achieve a significant international reputation in the next five to ten years. Applicants who are more than 10 years away from having earned their highest degree and where career breaks exist, such as maternity, parental, or extended sick leave, clinical training, etc. may have their eligibility for a Tier 2 Chair assessed through the program's Tier II justification process which can be found at <u>Justification Process</u>. The King's University understands the impact legitimate career interruptions can have on a candidate's record of research achievement and encourages potential candidates to explain in their application the impact this may have had on their record. Potential candidates should have an established record of excellence in research and must be able to demonstrate a strong interest and ability in communicating to undergraduate students and to wider audiences, plus a keenness to mentor students effectively.

Candidates are invited to submit an application including:

- an updated and complete curriculum vitae
- a letter of interest (maximum 6 pages) outlining:
 - their qualifications for a successful Chair nomination;
 - the fit of their profile and expertise in the identified research areas;
 - the vision and future research program for the Chair;
 - opportunities for training highly qualified personnel;
 - the potential for the Chair to enhance the mission and vision of the University in strategic areas.
- Three letters of reference, mailed to The King's University by the reference providers.



Academic Rank:

Assistant Professor. Highly qualified candidates will be appointed at a higher rank.

Starting Date:

Depending upon the success of the nomination.

- Fall 2019 nomination deadline is October 21, 2019. Following a successful nomination, the starting date will be July 1, 2020.
- Spring 2020 nomination deadline is April 20, 2020. Following a successful nomination, the starting date will be January 1, 2021.

Appointment is subject to budget approval by the University's Board of Governors.
