**Position Summary:** Teach *Social Work 200: Introduction to Social Work* in the Fall term of the 2019-2020 academic year. This class meets Tuesday/Thursday from 3:30 - 4:50 p.m.

**Course Description:** SOWK200: Students in this course will learn about the history of social and social welfare in Canada. The course will focus on helping students to understand the social movements, sociocultural practices, and ethics that have contributed to development of Social Work as a profession, as well as the values that inform the profession. The course is designed to help students recognize the relationships between history, theory, and praxis in social interventions, with the goal of contemplating the various ways in which a society can ethically respond to human need and social suffering. Students also will gain some perspective on research in Social Work, as well as the role of social workers and their practice around the globe.
